Chew Magna Parish Council would like to reiterate and enforce our previous comments regarding this application as sent 11th April 2012 and below:

Chew Magna Parish Council wishes to record its opposition to this proposal for the infilling of **Stowey Quarry** when the materials being deposited could include asbestos.

The Parish Council is very concerned by the potential serious harmful impact the deposit of asbestos waste could have upon the water emanating from springs and aquifers in this area of the Mendip Hills which feed into the Chew Valley Lake Reservoir and provide so much of our local domestic water.

Other issues of concern are a) the possibility of air pollution from dust and its effect upon the environment and the wild life and b) the impact of further Heavy Goods Vehicles on rural roads across the Chew Valley as some vehicles travelling from the West and South West are unlikely to adhere to the indicated access route to the site from the A37.
