Dear Mr. Joyce

Thank you for the letter attached to your latest email. Apologies for not responding sooner as I have only returned from a period of leave.

I refer to the reference made in the letter to the Inspector's interpretation of Mr. Rob Harper's proof and HRA and would state that Mr. Harper has clarified his position as states below:

My HRA shows that full range SNRHW would be a problem for groundwater if there were any present in the downgradient strata. The last paragraph on the first page of Michael Joyce's letter to Oaktree of 14th August is therefore incorrect: I am saying it is *potentially* capable of being engineered to accept a lesser specification SNRHW, not that applied for.

The HRA shows (in the additional risk model scenarios) that if a less-polluting SNRHW material (limited to 3 x inert WAC concentrations in the leachate) was disposed at the site AND the landfill liner was shown to have a greater attenuation potential than that depicted in the HRA (which could be reasonably expected), then negligible groundwater risk is envisaged. The HRA shows only a very long term risk for arsenic under these circumstances.

I trust that this can be conveyed to the Inspector.

On the issue of the Statement of Common Ground, I would confirm that I have received a copy of the document drafted in conjunction with SLR Consulting (for the LPA) and will read through before signing and returning for despatch.
