Further to my previous comments on the original application, there are new issues to consider, which have a bearing on the potential impacts on ecology and the Chew Valley SPA. My previous comments are not now applicable.

1. The issues raised by the Environment Agency (EA) in their letter dated 20th April 2012 including their concern about a lack of clarity regarding the nature of material to be deposited at the site. All the EA concerns need to be addressed in order to demonstrate that there would be no harm to ecology and to the Chew Valley Lake SPA.
2. There is a population of White Clawed Crayfish very close to the site. Assessment of impacts on water quality must include sufficient assessment of impacts on this species and contain sufficient information to demonstrate that the population of this species, and their habitat (and water quality), will not be harmed by the proposal.

I therefore object to the proposal.
